



CTD's County Ecumenical Officer, Katja Babei, was pleased to be able to attend **'Nourishing the Roots - a Chance to Refresh Our Ecumenical Vision'**, the Churches Together in England Conference for Ecumenical Officers in Swanwick, 28-30<sup>th</sup> September, along with CTD's Chair, Major Katrina Greetham and the Methodist and URC representatives Dudley Coates and Peter Clark. It provided a space for open conversation, reflecting the diversity of tradition. The many challenges during Covid were discussed with possibilities for the future including being more distinctly outward-facing and aligned with mission and witness, nimble structures, being attentive to and focussed on the local level and being fuelled by strong personal relationships.

A key text discussed was Pope Francis' book, *Let Us Dream - The Path To A Better Future* and its theme of synodality.

## News from across the Dorset churches

Christmas was marked in a number of ways by Dorset churches. Christmas Services took place with some livestreamed ; Swanage United Reformed Church posted Advent Verses and Art on Facebook, and the Bournemouth Community Church online Lessons and Carols ; Poole and North Deanery put together a

booklet, '2021 Advent Reflections'.

Christian Aid (Wimborne Area) had to cancel their Christmas Eve lunch, but a collection for the Christmas Appeal took place on the Minster Green, its theme 'Impossible Choice' focusing on mothers on the frontline of the climate crisis. A Nativity Trail was organised by Refresh churches and Weymouth BID, with carols in Hope Square. Sherborne churches' Christmas Day lunch was cancelled, but those who expressed an interest in the lunch were offered a delivered meal, courtesy of Sherborne Community Kitchen.

### News from across Dorset churches

On Thursday, 6<sup>th</sup> January at 11am, a Celebration of the Baptism of Christ will take place at the Orthodox Church of Christ the Saviour, Winton and a Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Service will take place at St Francis of Assisi Church, Winton. A working group is being set up by Churches Together in Winton, Moordown and Charminster to consider how to support families in food poverty, some ideas being practical pilot projects around the theme of cooking and healthy eating and giving items away to those in need.

Churches Together in Poole is asking local churches to contribute passages to form a Lent booklet, as in Advent. Refresh Praise, the monthly worship service, has taken place at St Aldhelm's Church, Weymouth and on Zoom. Refresh and the Lantern's night shelter, Safe Sleep 2022, begins on 3rd January.

St Aldhelm in Purbeck has implemented an initiative to renew Hope through rural ministry and mission, helping young adults explore God's call to ordained ministry in a rural setting. '<u>Walking Church'</u> invites people to join an hour's walk from one of the churches in the Benefice, engaging in biblical reflection.

Faithworks and St Michael's Church, Bournemouth teamed up to provide a **'Night to Remember'** for those loved and lost in the last year ; St John's in Broadstone also held a service reflecting on the different types of loss experienced throughout COVID.
