8. News from Churches

Swanage: The church enjoyed a wonderful Messy Easter in Holy Week, attended by over 70 children and carers. They are hoping to run another event in October Half Term. They are now looking forward to welcoming holiday makers and other groups at Sunday Worship.

Wool: Churches Together in Wool is beginning to regenerate and they are looking forward to the future joint occasions.

Broadstone: The 20 year celebrations are well under way. Since the last meeting the church has enjoyed a Craft Fayre, Fish & Chip Quiz Evening, Trip to Exbury Gardens and the next one event 17th June is a boat trip up to Wareham with a Fish & Chip Supper. These events are supported by members, friends and regulars who frequent the Coffee Lounge. The church enjoyed a good Pentecost Service with Rev Karen and the last hymn "Gods Spirit it is my Heart" was sung outside witnessing to the local community

Bournemouth: A service to celebrate the first year of the Welcome Inn Café, held at Victoria Park, was celebrated last Sunday with the worship band. A Forum Group has been established to discuss how to be relevant in the future and to meet the changing needs. Divided into three teams they are 'Dream Team, Prayer Team & Logistic Team.

Upton: The Chapel Anniversary went well with the music band accompanying, with lots of children attending. The Pre-School is fully subscribed until September '24. The recent Daisy Chain event went well and another four sessions are planned.

Poole: Three young people have recently come into membership, thanks expressed to Barry Matthews. The Explorer services continue to be popular and well supported. The Wesley Café continues its outreach to the community and thanks were expressed to the circuit for its financial and manpower input. The café itself supports 25 young people, aged 15-30 with special needs. The cafe has provided 2201 meals in the last 12 months as part of the 'Meals for Free' Scheme.

9. Circuit Invitations Business / Staffing

This year we have three ministers in the Stationing Process, Rev Karen James, Rev Betto Viana and Deacon Suzie Viana. Preliminary conversations are being held with circuit stewards to discuss their call and the future. It will be a two track approach, extensions (re-invitations) and

Going forward the CLT have discussed, when the time arises, as to where the ministers are to be based: Rev Karen or her replacement to stay with the current churches, the Superintendent to be based in Poole and another minister based in the Bournemouth area with the deacons continuing to work across the Circuit. The Circuit Invitation Committee will be meeting soon.

10.1 Mission Updates – Deacons Gill and Suzie

The diaconal focus 'Godly Play' is going from strength to strength, going into schools as well as at Victoria Park. It can be adapted for different ages. The Food Bank continues to operate from the St Georges site, the team is committed and strong to meet the current needs. The Sleep Safe Project has changed completely because of Covid. The Stay Safe Project, for the homeless in Bournemouth, operates from Trinity on a Thursday. The Toddlers Groups are going well with names being put on a waiting list. The Welcome Inn asked customers what the café meant to them and the feedback was very positive. All manner of activities can be experienced or maybe simple quiet prayer is all that's needed.

Kate's report had been circulated previously and was adopted by the meeting.
